




MBA Orientation Program

LIBRARY FACILITIES

sitting capacities for the students. At present the library has collection of about 489 Titles with 3160 plus books including good collection of prescribed text books, reference books, etc. Hard copies of national & international journals are present in the library; apart from this students can also access Emerald for electronic journals through VTU consortium.
